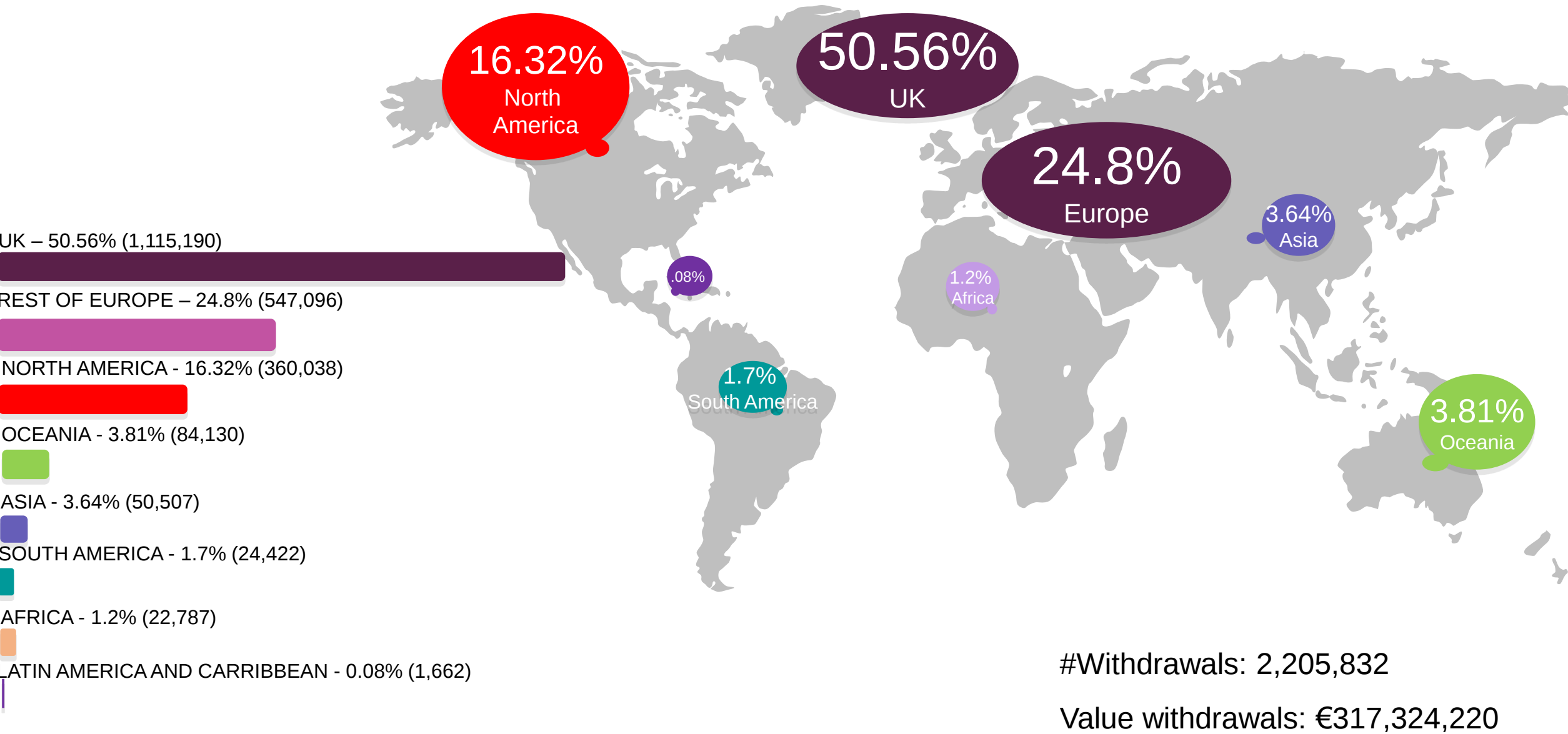

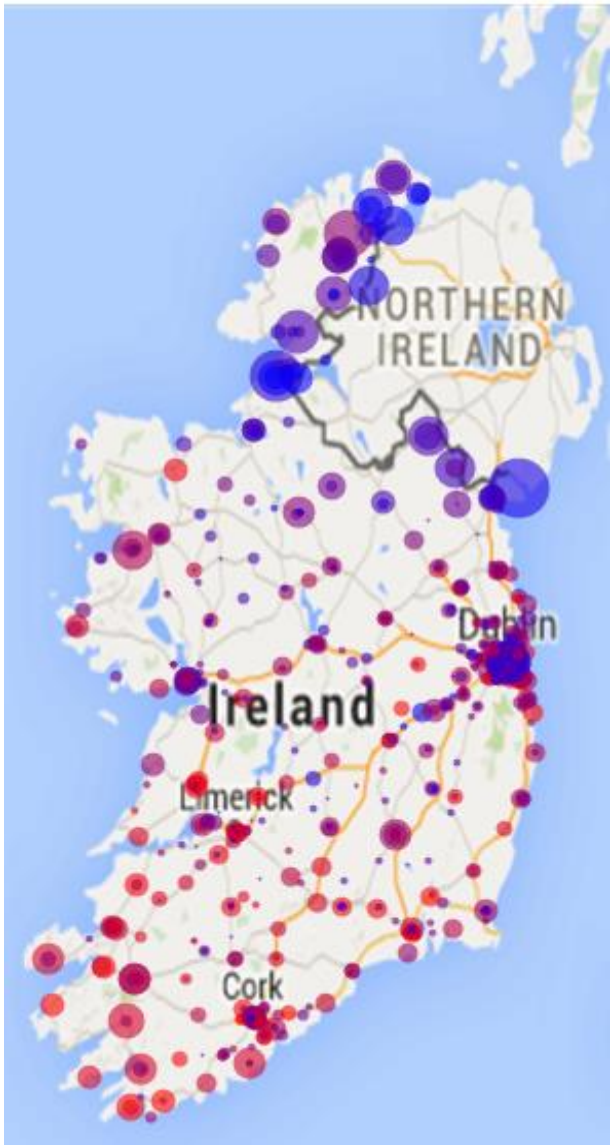

2013



- Large average withdrawals (€235 in 2013)
- 4 of 5 top ATMs associated with third-level institutions (Maynooth, UCD, Dundalk IT, NUIG)

2014



- Large average withdrawals (€270 in 2014)
- Reduced activity on West coast
- Third-level institutions in top 5 ATMs (UCD, Dundalk IT, Maynooth)

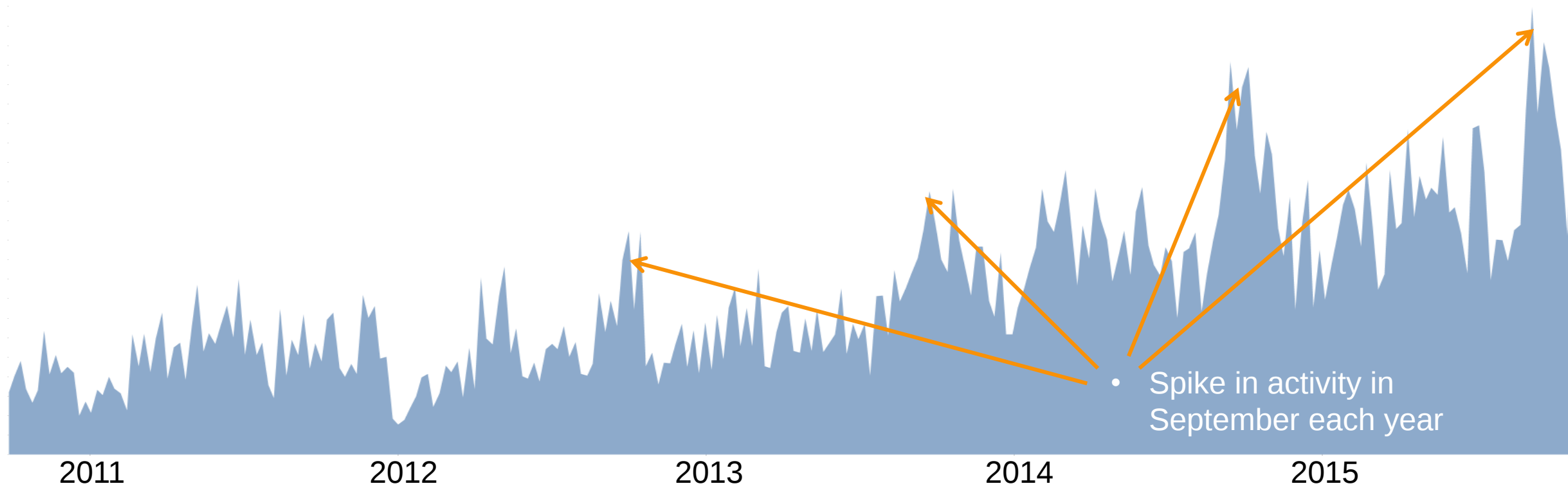
2015



- Large average withdrawals (€220 in 2015)
- Very little activity in North-West
- UCD, Waterford IT, NUIG in top 10 ATMs

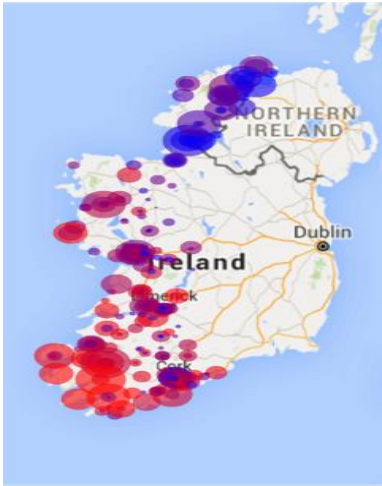
Snapshot of Activity by Visitors From India (2010-2015)

- Interesting data set.

- Granular details have been omitted due to the smaller data set when compared with other countries.

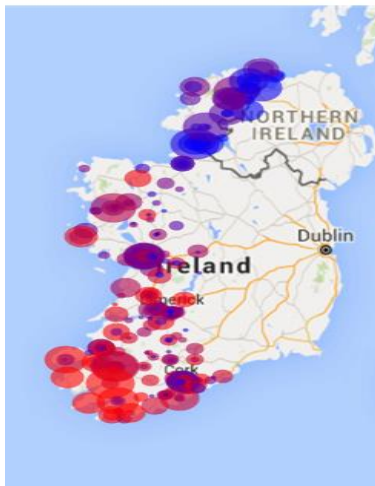


Overview of Activity: Wild Atlantic Way

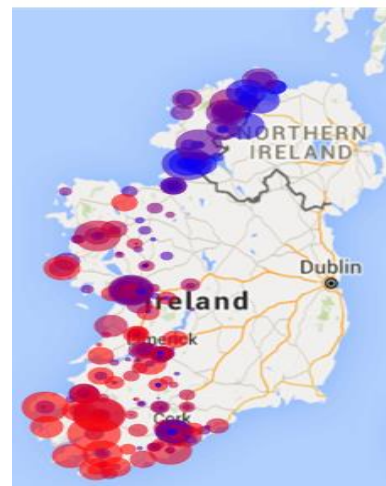

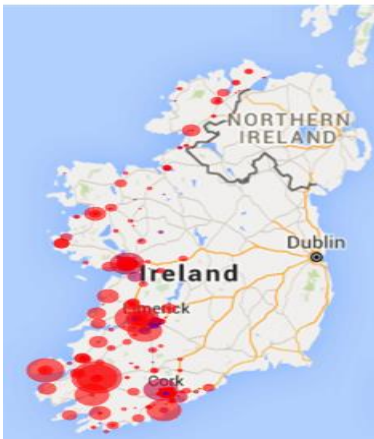

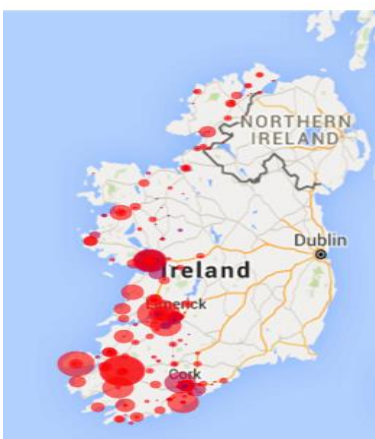

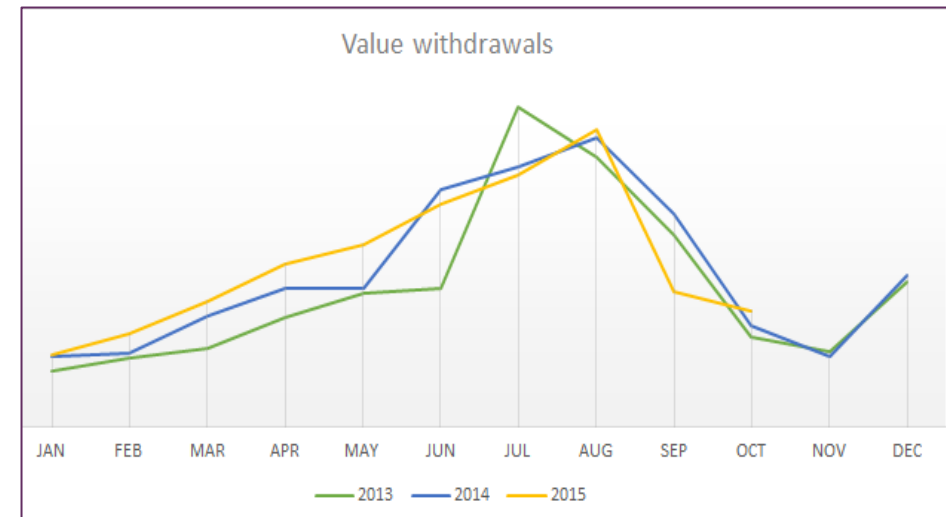

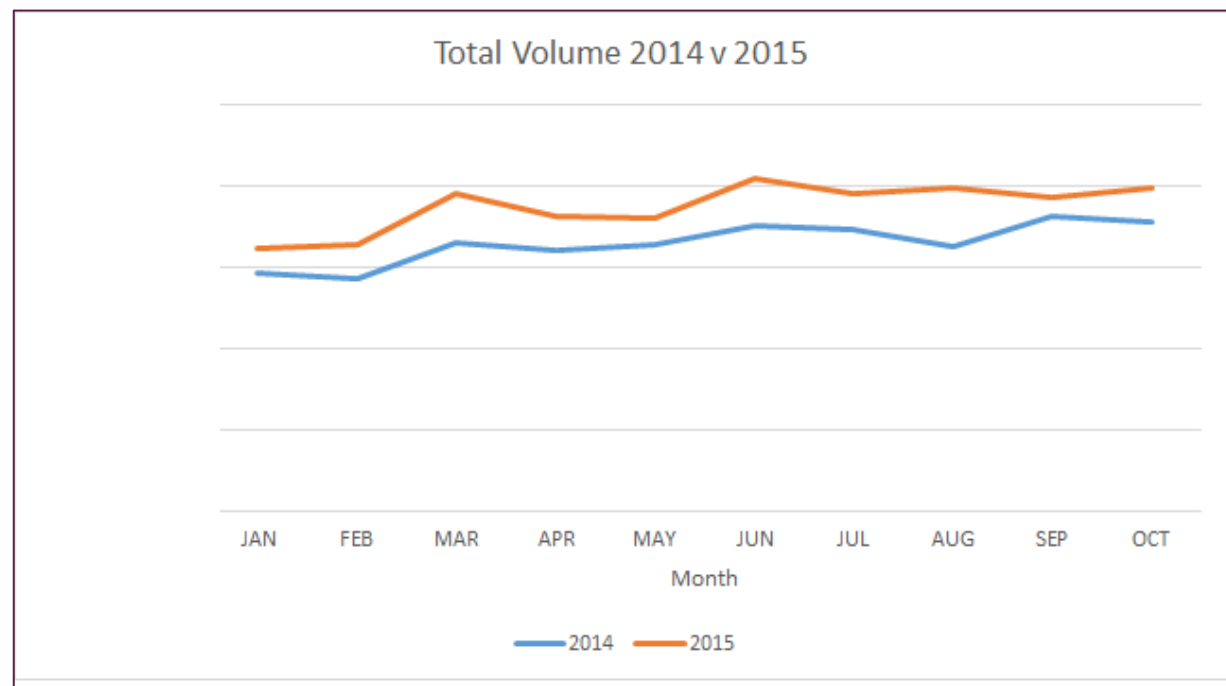
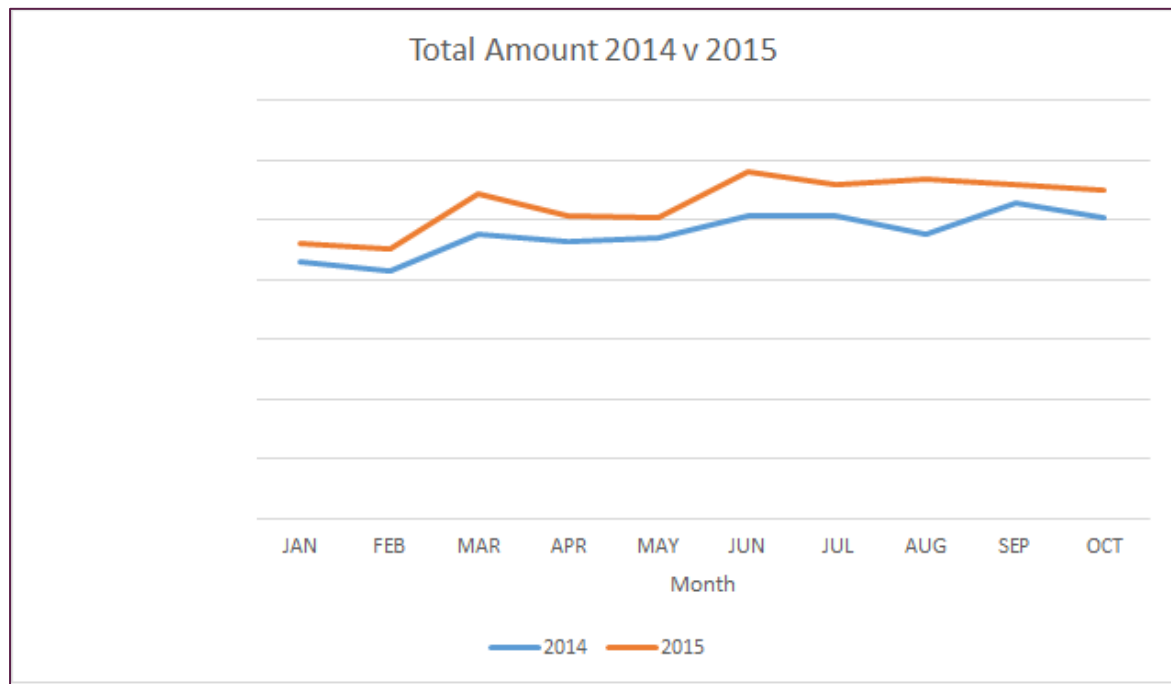


Visitors from North America



Conclusion: In keeping with the broader reduction in ATM transactions, the above demonstrates an overall positive trend in Wild Atlantic Way activity.

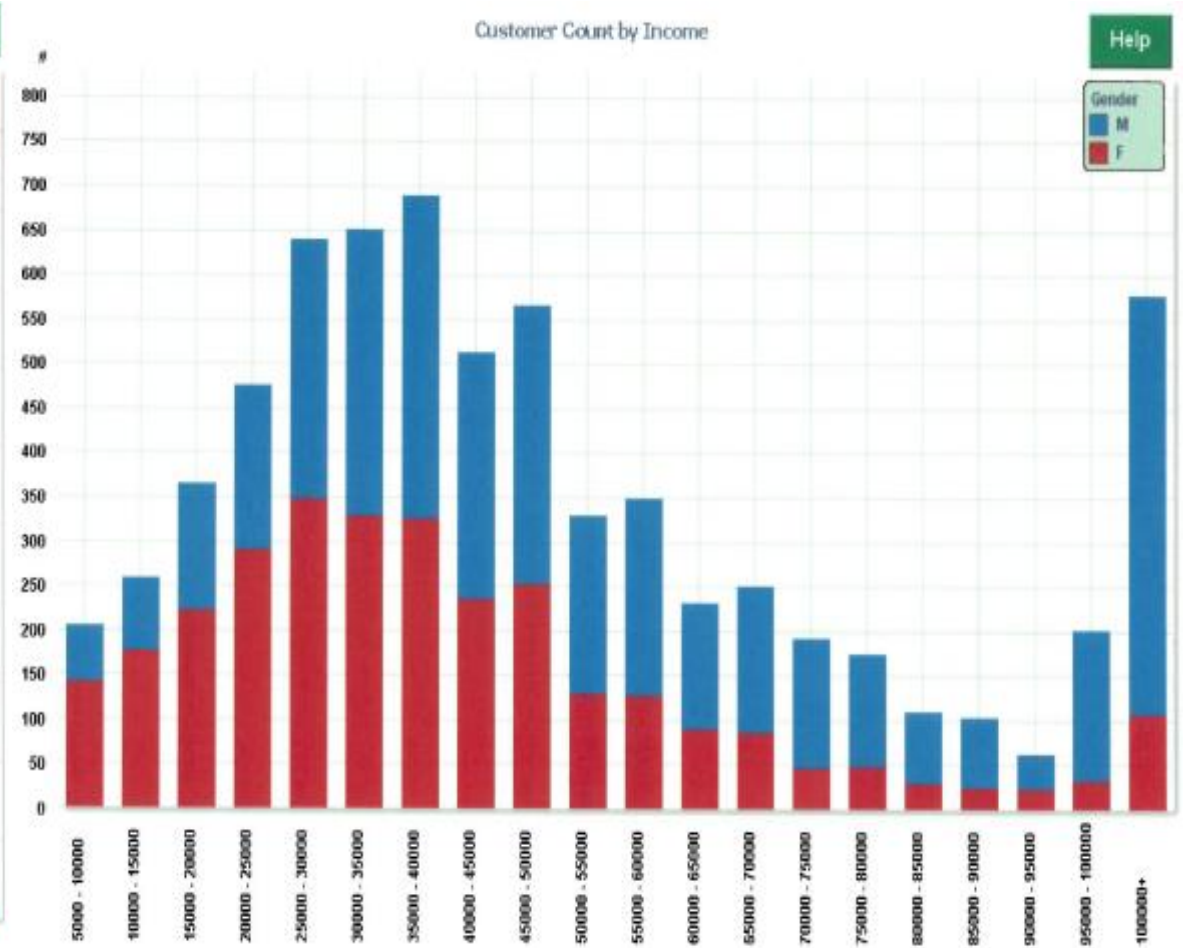
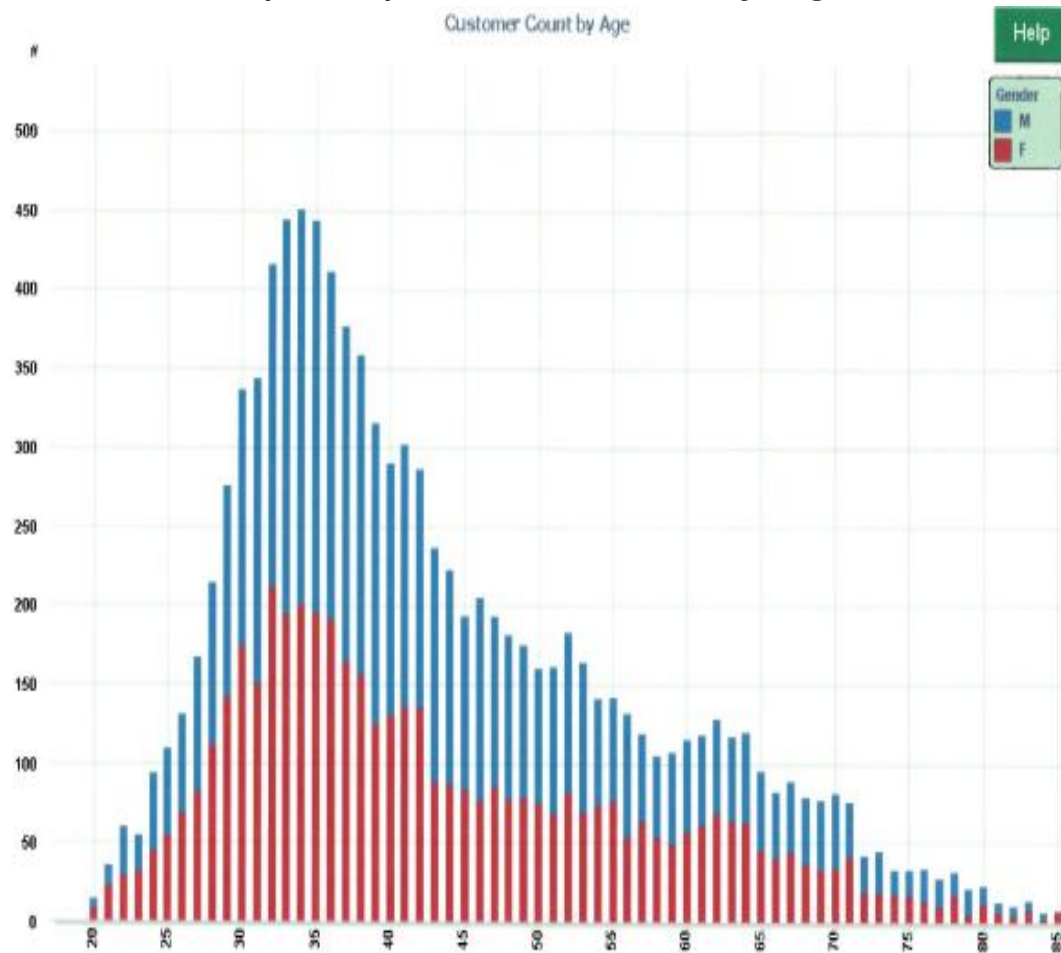
Point of Sale Transactions 2014-2015
